### Joshua 6


We're going to focus on the story of Joshua and God's people the Israelites and the battle of Jericho!

Help us to trust you and be faithful to you even during these difficult times knowing that you are the God who gives us the victory.


Help us to be faith carriers in our communities and share the hope we have in you with others.

#### Discussion

A question for adults to ask children

What instructions did God give to Joshua to follow? How do you think the Israelites felt following God's instructions?



It must have been difficult doing the same thing every day and trusting that God was going to give them the city. The people inside the city would probably have been watching and maybe even laughing. God's people knew however that God always keeps his promises and they kept going, doing exactly what God had told them.

# Family Activity 1

Sound the trumpets!

You will need: any craft materials or empty cartons/boxes from around the house.

Make your own musical instruments from things you have around the house... here are some suggestions:

- A shaker using rice or beads and an empty bottle or container.
- A trumpet from a cut-down empty milk bottle
- A guitar by stretching elastic bands across an empty container or box.

#### A verse to remember

# Family Activity 2 Joshua Stones

The Israelites had come a long way to get to Jericho, out of slavery in Egypt, through the red sea, into the wilderness for forty years and then finally through the river Jordan and into the promised land.

As they passed through the river, the tribes of Israel collected rocks and placed them at the point where they crossed, as a reminder of all that God had done for them in the past and all his promises for the future.

### You can read this story in **Joshua Chapter 3**.

Just as the Israelites built a pile of rocks to remind them of how God had looked after them.; why not start your own rock collection in your home?

Collect some rocks from your own garden or street, or just use some Lego or Jenga blocks if you have some in the house.


Take it in turns to place one in the pile and remember a good time you have had together as a family or a time when you know that God has been with you.


